Paving The Way

Everyone likes a smooth drive. So, the Beechwood Village City Council has prioritized a new round of street repaving. First on the list are Sage Road, Ring Road, and Cordova Road.

Before paving, these streets will be milled to remove the top layer of old pavement. This helps the new pavement bond more solidly, and also prevents the streets from growing higher and higher over time.

The planning process is already underway. Final timing of the paving projects will depend on the weather and the availability of contractors.

Beechwood Village has adopted a new Criminal Nuisance Ordinance. This new ordinance augments the original Nuisance Ordinance adopted in 2019.

The purpose of the Criminal Nuisance Ordinance is to target criminal activity, repeat violations, and incidents involving multiple law enforcement actions. The ordinance also holds landlords accountable for activities at their rental properties.

Fall Lawn Care

Autumn means cooler temperatures will be on the way. For most of us in Beechwood Village, it also means working on the lawn and picking up leaves. Here are some tips to get the job done right:

By ordinance, grass in Beechwood Village must be kept to no more than 6 inches long. Please make sure you're mowing regularly.

Leaves and grass clippings should be bagged or placed in a separate can/tote and left next to the street at the front of the property.

Leaf bags must be made of paper or other biodegradable material. Leaves and yard waste left in regular plastic garbage bags will not be picked up.

Twigs, limbs, and branches must be placed in their own can/tote, or tied in bundles. Bundles

should measure no more than 4 feet long and 6 inches in diameter, and should not weigh more than 50 pounds.

Loose piles of leaves, limbs, or branches will not be picked up. Neither will stumps, tree trunks, large limbs, and items which do not meet the specifications above.

Leaf burning is strictly prohibited in Beechwood Village.

Yard waste is collected on Mondays, the same as regular trash and recycling.

Please be a good neighbor and attend to your yard waste in a timely fashion. Also, if you own a rental property, please ensure your tenants understand how the yard waste collection process works.
