Trash Collection: What Goes Where?

Now that Waste Management has delivered our new, larger recycling bins, some residents have questions about what goes where.

The new recycling bins have yellow lids. The bins with yellow lids should be used **ONLY** for recycling. Anything else placed in a bin with a yellow lid may not get picked up. Recycling is now collected on a two-week cycle, every other Monday.

Regular trash goes in either the older black Anytime bins or the newer Waste Management bins with green lids. Regular trash gets picked up every week on Monday.

Yard waste should be placed in compostable bags or a separate container you supply. That is also picked up every Monday.

Placing the right item in the right place helps to speed up the waste collection process, and also ensures everything you set out gets picked up properly.

Holding The Line On Taxes

Our Beechwood Village property tax rate will stay flat for another year. The current rate of 10 cents per \$100 assessed valuation will continue through fiscal year 2022-2023. Your city government works hard to deliver quality services, while also controlling expenses and balancing the city budget. We're proud to hold our taxes low.

Time Is Running Out

All Beechwood Village elective offices are open and on this year's ballot. If you're interested in running, there's not much time left.

These are paid, parttime positions. City Council members serve two-year terms, and earn \$2,400/year. The Mayor serves a four-year term with an annual salary of \$8,000.

The filing deadline for all offices is Tuesday, June 7th.

Boats And RV's

Summer is the time for outdoor adventure and recreation. As you're planning your outings, please keep in mind that parking boats, trailers, buses, or recreational vehicles is not permitted on Beechwood Village city streets.

Such vehicles may be parked in driveways for up to seven days for the purposes of cleaning and maintenance. Otherwise, pleasure watercraft 18 feet long or less may be stored behind the rear building line of the resident's property.

Mow The Grass And Avoid A Fine

The #1 most frequent code violation in our village is grass that's too long. With lawn care season here, please remember our maximum allowable grass length is 6 inches.

If you use a lawn service to maintain your grass, please make sure they know about this 6" limit. Whether you use a service or mow yourself, maintaining proper grass length is still the homeowner's responsibility. Violations will be cited.
