

## **Keep The Season Safe**

Here are some tips to ensure your holiday season is safe and accident-free:

- 1. Keep trees away from heat sources. Place your tree away from fireplaces and heaters, and keep a fire extinguisher near your tree.
- 2. Hydrate your live tree. A dried-out tree can catch fire faster than one that has been properly watered. Check the water level every other day.
- 3. Ask for help. When stringing lights and decorations above your normal reach, be sure to use a proper ladder with someone supporting the base.
- 4. Double-check your lights for safety.
  Replace any lights that have frayed wires, broken sockets, or loose connections.
- **5. Power down at bedtime.** Turn off all lights when you go to bed and before leaving the house to avoid a short circuit that could start an electrical fire.
- 6. Prevent electrical cord damage. Don't mount lights in a way that might damage the cords, and avoid using nails or tacks to hang lights. Use hooks or insulated staples, instead.
- 7. Secure candles. Keep candles on a sturdy base to prevent tipping. Never leave a lit candle unattended.
- 8. Use unbreakable ornaments. If you have fragile ornaments, place them out of the reach of pets and kids.
- Keep it real. Avoid decorations that look like candy or food if you have young children or pets — in the house.
- 10. Beware of poisonous plants. While festive, poinsettias are poisonous when eaten. So, keep them out of reach of children and pets.

## Reminders From Our Code Enforcement Officer

With the changing seasons, here are a few reminders from our city Code Enforcement Officer:

- Please collect and bag your leaves in a timely fashion.
- Use paper or compostable leaf bags (not plastic) and leave them at the curb for pickup.
- Ensure your trees, shrubs, and vegetation are trimmed to avoid intruding on streets, sidewalks, power lines, and the public right of way.
- Keep storm sewer grates clear of leaves and debris, which could block drainage.
- In the event of snow and ice, please don't park in the street, as it interferes with our snowplows.
- Be aware that winter weather can alter trash and recycling pickup schedules, if trucks cannot operate safely.
