Mow The Grass And Avoid A Fine

The #1 most frequent code violation in our village is grass that's too long. With lawn care season here, please remember our maximum allowable grass length is 6 inches. If you use a lawn service to maintain your grass, please make sure they know about this 6" limit.

Whether you use a service or mow yourself, maintaining proper grass length is still the homeowner's responsibility. Violations will be cited. Everyone in the village benefits from well-maintained lawns. Thanks for doing your share.

Trash and Recycling Collection Update

Due to a labor shortage, Waste Management is permanently transitioning to automatic lifting trucks, meaning that all trash, recycling, and yard waste must be picked up at the curb with wheels facing the house.

In addition, all trash and recycling must be placed in their respective bins. Any trash/recycling outside of the bin will no longer be picked up. If you do not have a garbage bin, one will be provided for you. They will still pick up one bulk item per home per week but ask that you call Customer Service at (866) 909-4458 or go to WM.com and click on "bulk pickup" to let them know. Once your

totes have been emptied, please remember to return them to the back or side of your home in a timely manner.

Trash will be picked up at the curb by an automatic lifting truck lifting the Garbage Tote – Weekly. If residents do not have a garbage tote one will be provided.

Recycling will be picked up at the curb by an automatic truck lifting the Recycling Tote – Every Other Week.

Yard Waste will be picked up at the curb and placed in the back of the truck just like before – Every Other Week.



Boats And RV's

Summer is the time for outdoor adventure and recreation. As you're planning your outings, please keep in mind that parking boats, trailers, buses, or recreational vehicles is not permitted on Beechwood Village city streets.

Such vehicles may be parked in driveways for up to seven days for the purposes of cleaning and maintenance. Otherwise, pleasure watercrafts 18 feet long or less may be stored behind the rear building line of the resident's property.

Our Fire Protection service is provided by St. Matthews Fire And Rescue. For non-emergency questions (fire safety, smoke alarms, etc.), call (502) 893-7825. For fire emergencies, dial 9-1-1.
