Reminders From Our Code Enforcement Officer

With the changing seasons, here are a few reminders from our city Code Enforcement Officer:

- Please collect and bag your leaves in a timely fashion.
- Use paper or compostable leaf bags (not plastic) and leave them at the curb for pickup.
- Ensure your trees, shrubs, and vegetation are trimmed to avoid intruding on streets, sidewalks, power lines, and the public right of way.
- Keep storm sewer grates clear of leaves and debris, which could block drainage.
- In the event of snow and ice, please don't park in the street, as it interferes with our snowplows.
- Be aware that winter weather can alter trash and recycling pickup schedules, if trucks cannot operate safely.

10 Tips for a Safe Holiday

Here are some tips to ensure your holiday season is safe and accident-free:

- Keep trees away from heat sources. Place your tree away from fireplaces and heaters, and keep a fire extinguisher near your tree.
- Hydrate your live tree. A dried-out tree can catch fire faster than one that has been properly watered. Check the water level every other day.
- Ask for help. When stringing lights and decorations above your normal reach, be sure to use a proper ladder with someone supporting the base.
- Double-check your lights for safety. Replace any lights that have frayed wires, broken sockets, or loose connections.
- Power down at bedtime. Turn off all lights when you go to bed and before leaving the house to avoid a short circuit that could start an electrical fire.

- Prevent electrical cord damage. Don't mount lights in a way that might damage the cords, and avoid using nails or tacks to hang lights. Use hooks or insulated staples, instead.
- **7.** Secure candles. Keep candles on a sturdy base to prevent tipping. Never leave a lit candle unattended.
- 8. Use unbreakable ornaments. If you have fragile ornaments, place them out of the reach of pets and kids.
- Stay safe walking. With the sun setting earlier, make sure to wear reflective equipment or use a flashlight if walking in the dark. Also, make sure to put animals on a leash when walking.
- **10.** Keep cars locked. To avoid break-ins, make sure to always lock your car.
